PASTOR TOM'S CORNER!

This month I want to share a reflection on Genesis 22.

"Keep Listening!" Abraham was given instruction by God to sacrifice his son Isaac on the mountain. The wood was there, the boy was tied up, and the knife was shining in the sun poised over the child.... This was the child of promise; the one God empowered to be born from folks who were way too old to have children. This was the son who was to be the second generation of God's chosen people. This was a beginning of the people counted by the sands in the sea and the stars in the heaven. And the knife was about to end all that.

"Keep Listening!" I am not sure what Abraham was thinking. Maybe it was something like this... "You gave Isaac to me; you want him back, fine... I still believe you will do the great nation promise." Or, "I believe your promise, if this is how you want it, even with Isaac dead, you have a better plan than I have, maybe you can raise him back up, so be it."

"Keep Listening!" The knife begins is downward plunge and a voice interrupts, "Abraham, Abraham!" Abraham replies "Hush up; I am doing what God wants!" Ka-Thunk! No, that is not what happened. The response was, "Here I am." Abraham kept listening.

We may read the Bible and know exactly in our hearts what God wants. But keep listening! Many things have changed since the writing of the scriptures. That is why it is so important that when we read and apply the scriptures today, we also consider the traditions of the church, our reason, and the experience of the Holy Spirit speaking to our hearts daily.

Sure, we may have it all figured out, but that is no excuse not to "Keep Listening!"


The Lenten Bible study has been good, we are all learning together. Since we did not complete all the healing stories, we will keep going...

Spring greetings from the Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry! As usual we had a busy March and continued to see the number of families we support increase. The second Tuesday in March we served 35 families. That's 10 more than our previous high mark.

I used to count the number of bottles of cooking oil on hand and that's how I counted the families. Each family always takes one. Recently I had to count the rolls of TP! (IoI). I stack the TP in stacks of 4 which is how many each family is allowed to take and I put out 30 stacks of 4. They all went and I had to stock some more.

We've received some funds to support the pantry and we've found a great partner in Saint Andrews Presbyterian down the street before the bridge. Their minister works at a food pantry in downtown Suffolk and they get overstock from Food Lion. We regularly get just over 20 dozen eggs every two weeks and this past week we received 20 bags of fresh oranges!!!



MISSIONS ACTIVITY

Missions is now working with the CHILDREN'S CENTER of Suffolk. The Center serves Western Tidewater families and focuses on the heathly development of children including children with disabilities and developmental delays. We will be collecting girls' and boys' underwear sizes 3T, 4T, 5T & 6 for the months of April and May. Receptacles will be placed in both buildings for the donations.

Also, Missions is partnering with BRIDGE THE GAP OUTREACH CENTER of Suffolk. BTG receives donations from large corporations which can span the gambit from food, electronics, health care products and cleansing products. Many of the liquid items arrive in bulk so they need <u>clean empty plastic bottles</u> to transfer the liquids to usable sizes for their clients to take home. They are looking for detergent and cleansers bottles and the heavier plastic drink bottles would work too. What a good way to recycle and being part of the Methodist's green program. This will be an ongoing project for us.


