
Food Pantry hours: 1st & 3rd Tuesday 10:30-2:00

Year End Report

The food pantry has made it to the end of the year, barely! While the change to only opening the first and third Tuesday each month has helped it hasn't diminished the number of "families". In fact, the number continues to grow by word of mouth in the Hispanic community.

With the help of our Spanish translator Susan Cox, we recently conducted a survey. What we would consider a family (shopper) on this particular Tuesday was 20 families. From the survey we discovered we were feeding 48 adults and 40 children.

On the first Tuesday in December I got to the pantry at 9:15 to prep for the day. There were already 4 cars waiting for the 10:30 opening. By 11:45 the crowd was gone and the pantry cleaned out of all the essentials, oil, flour, sugar, salt, cereal, ketchup, mustard, mayo, pasta, pasta sauce and black/red dried beans.
