PASTOR TOM'S CORNER!

Before my father became an Episcopal priest, he was a chemical engineer. As such, he was well informed and invested in the scientific method. It was so entrenched in him that it is what he used when he became a Christian. He saw that science and education were not going to save humanity from themselves, therefore he postulated there must be another way. A woman challenged him to "try God." He prayed, "God if you are out there and have a solution to this mess, prove you are here." Apparently, God showed up and gave my father hope that this world can get better. He eventually found proof that our self-destructive human condition can be changed if we would only encounter God and let God change us. It was still the scientific method: make a theory, run experiments, check the results, refine the theories.

This became part of my grounding as well. It has even worked its way into my understanding of discipleship. Try to listen to God (form a theory), do what God says (experiment) and see what happens (test the results). Then go back and keep listening. The results call us to listen better, to continue to try new things, and then continue to see what happens.

I also found some good news in this. When it comes to our faith, there are no real failures. If we aim to follow God and fall short, we are forgiven. God does not give up on us...<u>ever</u>! Second, if we really mess up, God can make good come from it. We call that redemption. More on this in another article.

In the meantime, let us continue to try to listen to God (form a theory), do what God says (experiment) and see what happens (test the results). Amen?


